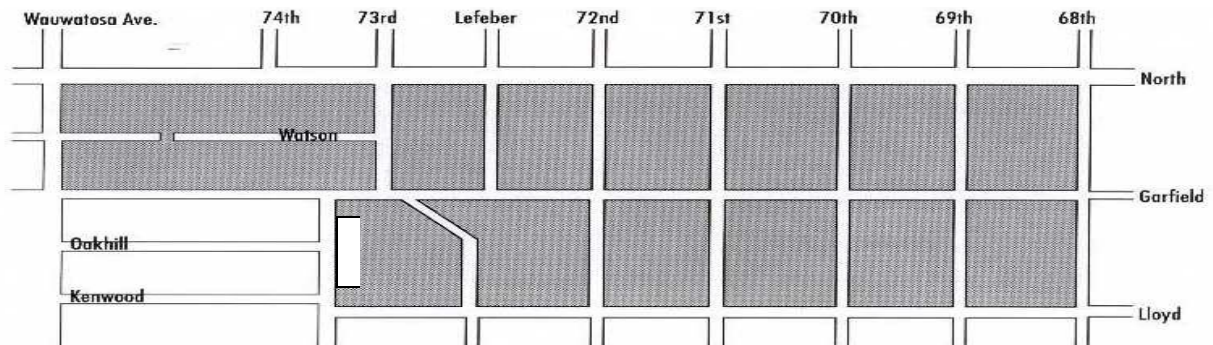
Inglewood Heights Neighborhood Rummage: May 6-8

Crime Prevention Tips from the Wauwatosa Police Dept.

- Contact Community Safety Officer Don Semega (471-8430 x5114) for a **free home security screening/survey** in order to detect areas where homes can be made more secure.
- Contact the Wauwatosa Police Department to report suspicious behavior. Examples of suspicious behavior might include walkers looking up & down driveways as they walk; ringing doorbells and then no is seen through the peep hole (*a method to case whose home*) or solicitors who are unable to show their city seller's permit to solicit. (*An official "No Soliciting" sign can be googled, printed and taped onto the front door.*)
- Consider installing more lighting. Low wattage fluorescent bulbs on the side of garages, which goes on at dusk and stays on all night. He also suggests landscape lighting around the front and back landscaping of homes.
- All **homes should have Block Watch signs** in the front and/or back windows. He believes it does not look like a cohesive Block Watch to the criminal if only a few neighbors have signs, so he recommends that every house have them in full view. (*Contact Officer Semega is you need one.*)
- It was suggested, that when a resident is away from their homes, **they leave an indoor house light on and a radio talk show on.** Dogs can also be a deterrent.
- Residents are welcome to each get their own security camera systems, however, the cameras cannot be pointed on any neighbor's property for legal reasons. The suggestion to have fake cameras in the alley to deter criminals was dismissed as it also could become a liability issue, as it may make other's walking through the alley feel safe when it isn't.
- He suggests engraving **valuable items in your house with the last 4 digits of your SSN and the last 2 digits of your driver's license.** (Protects identity). (*The Tosa Police Dept have an electric engraver to borrow for free and Gloria has a manual Carbide Engraving Tool, which works very well, if anyone wants to sign it out.*)
